

SYDNEY. 10th June, 1916. Please arrange for steps to be at once taken to quietly and most confidentially summarise all particulars relating to Greeks resident in New South Wales. resident in New South Wales. As far as possible personal particulars should be furnished as to each individual. Where, however, this isimpracticable owing to the numbers or other difficulties, particulars should be furnished of approximately the numbers of any colonies of Greeks, the locality, means of communication whether rail, ship, or coach, and distances from Sydney.

With regard to cafes, clubs, or recognised centres where
Greeks congregate, the namesof the proprietors, managers, nature etc
of such clubs should be obtained and a close watch kept upon these
establishments without in any way attracting attention or exciting suspicion. particulars of individual Greeks can be furnished Personal in the form set out hereunder marked "A".

Particulars of Glubs, cafes, colonies, or centres where

Greeks are known to congregate can be set out in the form marked "B" hereunder. Sufficient copies of this circular memo are being forwarded to Superintendents in charge of Districts to allow of one copy being sent to Inspectors in charge of a Division or Sub-District, or Sergeant in charge.

The utmost expedition must be used in the preparation of the forms. In Divisions or Sub-Districts where no Greeks reside, the Officer in charge should furnish promptly a Nil return, and keep close observation on any influx of personsof Greek rationality after such Nil return has been furnished.

The returns when completed must be forwarded by the District Superintendents to this office marked "SECRET AND CONFIDENTIAL". Form "A".
